Bachelor of Natural Medicine

As a student you will gain critical knowledge and understanding of herbal medicine, nutrition, anatomy, physiology and pathophysiology. You will gain sound clinical experience and practice, enabling you to support and motivate people to achieve optimum health and wellness.

It is recommended that you study the degree full-time over three years. However part-time options are available. The first two years of the programme may be studied on-campus or via online learning. Classes are live-streamed and recorded for online learners. The third year (the clinical programme) is delivered on-campus only.

Full-time study requires 16 hours class attendance per week, plus at least an equivalent 16 – 20 hours of self-directed learning.



Enrolment Criteria

Enrolment into the degree normally takes place in October to mid-November for the following year.

The enrolment process is online and requires a non-refundable application fee. The process will require the submission of a variety of documents at each stage of the enrolment process, and may involve an interview.
